Bidens cernua

NODDING BUR-MARIGOLD is an annual. Native to North America - and possibly New Zealand, it has daisy-like, yellow-centred, yellow to white flowers.

It is also known as Beggarticks, Bur-marigold, Double tooth, *Dvouzubec nicí* (Czech), *Graban Ogwydd* (Welsh), *Gulskära* (Swedish), *Nickskära* (Swedish), Nodding beggarticks, Nodding burr-marigold, Nodding marigold, Small beggar's ticks, Small bur marigold, Smaller bur marigold, Spanish needles, Sticktight, and Water agrimony.

Cernua is Latin (face toward the ground, falling headlong) meaning 'drooping or nodding'. Ducks often enjoy the seeds.
