Bromus inermis

HUNGARIAN BROME is a grass. Native to Asia, and Europe (including Britain) it has pale green flower spikelets.

It is also known as Awnless brome, *Bladfaks* (Norwegian), Brome grass, *Brome de Hongrie* (French), *Brome inerme* (French), *Brome sans arêtes* (French), *Bromo inerme* (Italian, Spanish), *Bromo liso* (Portuguese), *Bromo suave* (Mexican, Spanish), Bull grass, *Capim-cevadinha* (Portuguese), *Cebadille perenne* (Argentinian, Spanish), *Ffoderlost* (Swedish), *Forasacco spuntato* (Italian), *Grannenlose Trespe* (German, Swiss), *Idänkattara* (Finnish), *Kilçiksiz brom* (Turkish), *Kost'or bezostyj* (Russian), *Kostřavice bezosinná* (Czech), *Ko suzume no chahiki* (Japanese), *Kweekdravik* (Dutch), *Magyar roz nok* (Hungarian), *Rehukattara* (Finnish), Smooth brome, Smooth brome grass, *Staklø* (Danish), *Stoklas bezbranný* (Slovak), *Stoklosa bezostna* (Polish), *Sveřep bezbranný* (Czech), *Vihneetön kattara* (Finnish), *Wehrlose Trespe* (German), and *Wu mang que mai* (Chinese).

Inermis is Latin (unarmed) meaning 'spineless, unarmed or without prickles or stings'.

This grass has been cultivated for grazing and hay.
