*Digitalis grandiflora*

[Synonyms : *Digitalis ambigua*, *Digitalis orientalis*]

**LARGE YELLOW FOXGLOVE** is an evergreen biennial or perennial. Native to Europe and Asia it has pale creamy-yellow flowers that are brown netted inside.

It is also known as *Gelber Fingerhut* (German), *Grossblütiger Fingerhut* (German), *Grosser Gelber Fingerhut* (German), *Gul fingerborgsblomma* (Swedish), *Keltasormustinkukka* (Finnish), *Náprstník hlinožlutý* (Czech), *Náprstník velkokvětý* (Czech, Slovak), *Storblommig fingerborgsblomma* (Swedish), *Storblomstret fingerbøl* (Danish), Yellow foxglove, and Yellow perennial foxglove.

Warning – large yellow foxglove is poisonous.

*Grandiflora* is made up of Latin *grandis* (large) and *-flora* (flowered) components.

Although large yellow foxglove has similar properties to those of foxglove (*Digitalis purpurea*) it is not used medicinally.

Authorities believe that this species was introduced to Britain in 1596.
