*Eucalyptus pauciflora*

[Synonyms : *Eucalyptus coriacea*]

**WHITE SALLY** is an evergreen tree. Native to eastern and south-eastern Australia and Tasmania, it has smooth whitish bark and white flowers.

It is also known as Cabbage gum, Ghost gum, Snow gum, Weeping gum, White salee, and White sallee.

The white to light grey bark that sometimes shreds to reveal brownish-red patches and is often distinctively marked with large ‘scribbles’ that are made by larvae.

The flowers are pollinated by bees

*Pauciflora* is derived from Latin *pauci* (few) and *-flora* (flowered).

The flower nectar yields honey.

The fairly soft and lightish weight, light pinkish-brown wood is used locally for fence rails and firewood – and those trees growing on lower snow slopes provide shelter for animals.
