Galatella linosyris

GOLDILOCKS ASTER is a perennial. Native to the Mediterranean, it has yellow flowers. It is also known as *Astra zlatovlasá* (Slovak), *Chevelure-dorée* (French), Fine leaved, *Gold-Aster* (German), *Goldilocks*, *Gold y Mor* (Welsh), *Gullborste* (Swedish), *Hvězdnice zlatovlásek* (Czech), and *Zlatovlásek obecný* (Czech).

Goldilocks aster is considered to be threatened in the wild in Britain.

Linosyris means ‘flax-like (*Linum* genus)’.
