Galeopsis angustifolia

[Synonyms : *Dalanum angustifolium*, *Galeopsis ladanum* subsp. *angustifolia*, *Ladanella angustifolia*]

RED HEMP-NETTLE is an annual. Native to temperate Asia and Europe (including Britain), it has small, pale rose flowers each with a yellow-blotched throat and white-flecked lip.

It is also known as *Kalkdån* (Swedish), *Konopice úzkolistá* (Czech), *Konopička úzkolistá* (Czech), Narrowleaf hempnettle, Narrow-leaved hemp-nettle, *Penboeth Gulddail* (Welsh), *Schmalblättriger Hohlzahn* (German), and *Smaldån* (Swedish).

Red hemp-nettle is a protected plant in the Irish Republic under the Flora Protection Order 1987. It is also considered to be threatened in the wild in Britain.

Angustifolia is derived from Latin *angusti-* (narrow) and *-folia* (leaved) components.
