Nothoscordum borbonicum

[Synonyms : *Allium fragrans*, *Allium odonum*, *Nothoscordum fragrans*, *Nothoscordum inodorum*]

HONEYBELLS is a bulbous perennial. Native to South America it has small fragrant white flowers.

It is also known as *Aglio della Sicilia* (Italian), *Ail bâtard* (French), *Alho-sem-cheiro* (Portuguese), False onion weed, Fragrant false garlic, and *Strimlok* (Swedish).

Borbonicum means ‘of or from the Island of Réunion in the Indian Ocean’ which once bore the House of Bourbon’s name, or may commemorate the French Bourbon kings (1589-1792). This perennial is cultivated as an ornamental plant.
