Parapholis incurva

CURVED HARD-GRASS is an annual grass. Native to the Mediterranean and to western Europe it has slender and curved, bristly spikes of tiny, green or purplish spikelets. It is also known as Coast barb grass, *Corwelltyn Camaidd* (Welsh), Curly rye-grass, Curved sea hard-grass, Curved sicklegrass, *Gekrümmter Dünnschwanz* (German), Hard grass, Sicklegrass, and Thin tail.

Incurva is Latin (bent, curved, crooked) meaning ‘incurved, inflexed or bent inward’.
