Pelargonium x domesticum

[Synonyms : *Pelargonium angulosum* x *cucullatum*]

REGAL PELARGONIUM is a perennial hybrid. Developed in Britain it has small white, pink, red and purple flowers.

It is also known as Lady Washington geranium, Lady Washington pelargonium, Martha Washington, Martha Washington geranium, Martha Washington pelargonium, Pansy-flower geranium, Show geranium, and Show pelargonium.

This is a parent of many cultivated varieties.

Domesticum is derived from Latin *domesticus* (belonging to the house, domestic) meaning 'cultivated, or domesticated'.

Regal pelargonium is understood to be a complex hybrid that authorities believe was developed on the royal Sandringham Estate in Britain in about 1877.
