Petroselinum segetum

[Synonyms : *Apium segetum*, *Carum segetum*, *Sison segetum*]

CORN PARSLEY is an annual or biennial. Native to Belgium, central and southern Britain, to France and the Netherlands, it has tiny, white (occasionally pink or lilac) flowers.

It is also known as Corn caraway, *Eilunberllys* (Welsh), Honewort, *Höstpersilja* (Swedish), *Perejil* (Spanish), *Persil des moissons* (French), *Prezzemolo dei campi* (Italian), and *Wilde Petersilie* (German).

The plant is considered to be threatened in the wild in Britain.

Segetum means ‘of or from cornfields’.

Corn parsley has been eaten locally as an aromatic flavouring.
