Physalis viscosa

[Synonyms : *Alkekengi fissum*, *Cacabus parviflorus*, *Physalis fuscomaculata*, *Physalis pensylvanica*, *Physalis virginica*]

GROUND CHERRY is native to eastern North America.

It is also known as Grape ground-cherry, *Klewerige Appelliefie* (Afrikaans), Prairie ground-cherry, Starhair groundcherry, Stellate ground cherry, Sticky Cape-gooseberry, Sticky gooseberry, Sticky ground cherry, Sticky physalis and Yellow henbane.

Warning – all parts (except the ripe fruit) are poisonous and can cause gastro-entiritis.

Viscosa is derived from Latin *visci-* (sticky) meaning ‘sticky or clammy like bird-lime from mistletoe (*Viscum*) berries’.

The root was used by the North American Omaha Indians for treating wounds.
