*Quercus arkansana*

[Synonyms : *Quercus arkansana* var. *caput-rivuli*, *Quercus caput-rivuli*]

**ARKANSAS OAK** is a deciduous tree. Native to south-eastern Unites States, it has leathery, brown beneath, olive green leaves and brown acorns.

It is also known as Arkansas water oak, *Chêne d'eau* (French), *Chêne de l'Arkansas* (French), *Dub arkansaský* (Czech), Oak of Arkansas, and Water oak.

The flowers are pollinated by the wind.

*Arkansana* means 'of or from Arkansas, USA'.

Arkansas oak was first discovered in Arkansas and given its scientific name in 1911.

Authorities have pointed out that this tree, because of its scarcity and scrubbiness, is considered to be of little economic value.
