Sedum sexangulare

[Synonyms : *Sedum acre* subsp. *sexangulare*, *Sedum boloniense*, *Sedum sexangulare* var. *boloniense*, *Sedum mite*]

TASTELESS STONECROP is an evergreen succulent perennial. Native to Europe it has small yellow flowers and leaves that turn bronze in Winter.

It is also known as Insipid stonecrop, *Kantig fetknopp* (Swedish), Love entangle, *Milder Mauerpfeffer* (German), *Rozchodník bolonský* (Slovak), *Rozchodník boloňský* (Czech), *Rozchodník šestiřadý* (Czech), *Rozchodník tenkolistý* (Czech), *Särmämaksaruoho* (Finnish), and Tasteless yellow stonecrop.

Warning – tasteless stonecrop is potentially poisonous and should not be used internally as it can cause headaches, dizziness and nausea. External use can cause inflammation and blistering.

Sexangulare is derived from Latin *sex* (six) and *anguli-* (angle, corner) components meaning ‘with six angles’.
