Thymus pulegioides

[Synonyms : *Thymus alpestris*, *Thymus chamaedrys*, *Thymus glaber*, *Thymus montanus*, *Thymus ovatus*, *Thymus pulegioides* subsp. *chamaedrys*, *Thymus serpyllum* var. *albus*, *Thymus serpyllum* subsp. *chamaedrys*, *Thymus ucrainicus*]

BROAD LEAF THYME is an evergreen perennial subshrub. Native to Europe it has mauvish-pink flowers.

It is also known as *Arznei-Thymian* (German), *Bredbladet Timian* (Danish), *Bredtimjan* (Swedish), *Feld-Thymian* (German), *Gruwlys Gwyllt Mwyaf* (Welsh), Larger wild thyme, Large thyme, Lemon thyme, *Mateřidouška polejovitá* (Czech), *Mateřidouška vejčítá* (Czech), Mother of thyme, *Nurmiajuruoho* (Finnish), *Quendel* (German), and *Stortimjan* (Swedish).

Pulegioides is made up of the species name *pulegium* and Greek *-oides* (like) components meaning ‘like pennyroyal (*Mentha pulegium*)’.
