*Trifolium arvense*

**HARE’S-FOOT CLOVER** is an annual or biennial. Native to Europe it has mauve, pink or white flowers.

It is also known as Bottle grass, Calf clover, Cats-and-dogs, *D’atelina rol’ná* (Slovak), Dog-and-cat grass, Dogs-and-cats, Field clover, *Harklöver* (Swedish), *Hasenfuss* (German), *Hasenkee* (German), *Jänönäpila* (Finnish), *Jetel kočičí* (Czech), *Jetel rolní* (Czech), *Klee* (German), *Meillionen Gedenog* (Welsh), *Moscino* (Italian), Oldfield clover, *Patte-de-lièvre* (French), *Pied-de-lièvre* (French), Poverty grass, Pussies, Pussy cats, Pussy clover, Pussy-foot clover, Rabbit-foot clover, Stone clover, and *Tréfle des champs* (French).

Warning – hare’s-foot clover is potentially poisonous for some animals.

*Arvense* means ‘of or growing in cultivated fields or land’.

This clover is enjoyed by cattle.

Hare’s-foot clover has been used in veterinary medicine particularly in the treatment of horses.
