Umbilicus oppositifolius

[Synonyms : *Chiastophyllum oppositifolium*, *Chiastophyllum simplicifolium*, *Cotyledon oppositifolia*, *Cotyledon simplicifolia*]

LAMB’S TAIL is a creeping evergreen succulent perennial. Native to the Caucasus (the area between south-eastern Europe and western Asia), it has small creamy-yellow flowers.

It is also known as *Gouddruppeltje* (Dutch), *Gullbåge* (Swedish), and *Kultakaari* (Finnish).

Oppositifolius means ‘with opposite leaves or with leaves growing opposite and either side of a stem’.

Lamb’s tail is cultivated as a succulent ornamental plant and ground cover.
